## Parent's Corner



### Listening: Children & Youth

#### Children

It is equally important for us to listen to our children as it is first necessary to understand how they communicate. How better to do that than to listen to them.

Make eye contact with your child when he/she is speaking

Touch his arm to show that he has your full attention

Repeat back what he said for clarification

Taking a step back from each situation and truly listening to the child may help him feel validated and assist in the ability to problem solve.

Developing listening skills is an important step in parenting.

A parent who is a good listener will help a child develop problem solving skills.

#### Youth

Communication is the cornerstone of our relationship with teens.

Communication helps teens:

- Feel cared for and loved
- Believe they matter and are important to
- Feel safe and not alone with their worries
- Learn how to tell what they feel and need
- Learn how to talk openly

Here are a few great pointers on how we can do better as parents with communicating with our teens:

- Be available
- Don't let the TV, telephone, or other things distract or interrupt
- Eat dinner together as often as possible
- Be a good listener first and foremost
- Watch your tone and word choice when responding
- If your teen comes to you, recognize and thank him/her for trusting you to listen.
- Encourage teens to express their feelings
- Resist the urge to lecture or nag
- Be ready to hear opinions you may not agree with
- Ask questions about their ideas for solutions
- Don't always give answers
- If you are wrong...admit it!!

As a parent, just relax, take a few deep breaths, wait 5 minutes before you talk to your teen if you are angry, and most of all pray!!
